	The Constitution requires a minimum of seven and a maximum of nine directors,	
	with a minimum of five with close personal or family connection and a minimum of two without.	
	The Board currently has 7 directors meeting the Constitution's minimum requirements. Given the skills and experience of the current Board and the importance of setting our next strategic plan, the Board is recommending there should be 9 directors for 2025.	
	At the 2024 AGM 2 existing directors will retire in accordance with the constitution: Kellie Burns and Chris Lockwood have renominated, and both have a close personal connection to permanent care and adoption. Tracey McKay who was appointed as a casual vacancy in 2024 has nominated for election and has no close personal or family connection.	
	<ul> <li>There are four other directors not subject to election at this AGM:</li> <li>Three with close personal and family connection to permanent care or adoption, Naomi Colville, Judy Goulburn, Lynette Landry and</li> <li>One without, Kris Peach.</li> </ul>	
	There are five vacancies to achieve the maximum of nine directors, with a minimum requirement of two directors with close personal and family connection and one without.	
	We have received five nominations for the Board. Candidate statements from the five nominees are included with the proxy <u>form.</u>	
	The Board recommends the appointment of:	
	3 directors with close personal and family connection, Chris Lockwood, Kellie Burns, and Anson Le and	
	<ul> <li>2 directors without a close personal and family connection, Tracey McKay and Dashiel Lawrence.</li> </ul>	
	The Board recommends all the nominating directors be appointed for terms of 3 years, which will result in the maximum of nine directors, six with close personal and family connections and three without, which provides the Board with an appropriate mix of needed skills and experiences.
